CRIMINAL SEXUALITY

WHERE: Dawson County Sheriff's Office

WHEN: April 23 & 24, 2012

COST: \$160 per student

INSTRUCTOR: DONALD SPARRY**

This course introduces the investigator to the methods of behavioral analysis applied to the serial sexual offender. Using the techniques of applied criminal psychology developed by the FBI, the training focuses on actual case studies coupled with classroom exercises to develop leads in these often perplexing crimes. **This class does not qualify the graduate as a "profiler."**

**Donald Sparry was trained in 1980 by the original Behavioral Sciences Unit of the FBI and has conducted investigations and taught this course for the state of Georgia for more than 20 years. He was awarded a special commendation by the Director of the FBI for the profile that he produced on Most Wanted fugitive Ken Stanton.

SOCIAL NETWORKING FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT MANAGERS

WHERE: Dawson County Sheriff's Office

WHEN: May 8, 2012

COST: \$100 per student

INSTRUCTOR: CARA DONLON-COTTON

This class will cover some of the issues and concerns facing departments across the country. We'll examine policies and directives that need to be included in your agency's collection as well as review case studies. The very basics of social media will be covered to give examples of how they can be best used to screen your new hires as well as police your own force. We will address the right to privacy and how that affects government employees.

SOCIAL NETWORKING FOR INVESTIGATORS

This class will provide tools for criminal investigators who want to use social networking and internet
